Clarington Budget

Municipal Spending

Each year, Council approves the Municipal Budget to pay for services provided to the community. The budget pays for day-to-day operating costs and long-term capital expenses.

Total operating and capital budget.*

Clarington's total budget comes from local taxes as well as other revenue sources such as fees, reserve funds, interest, grants, penalties, and donations.

Total operating budget.* Pays for day-to-day operations, services, programs and facilities.


Total capital budget.* Pays for long-term infrastructure projects.

The remaining **\$7.06** pays for Culture, Municipal Law and Parking Enforcement, Economic Development, Communications, Animal Services, Building Inspection, Crossing Guards, Tourism, Community Grants, and Capital Financing.

Average assessed value of a home in Clarington

\$4,842.53 Average property taxes paid



Property taxes are calculated based on how much your home is worth (assessed value). The average assessed value of a home in other GTA municipalities tends to be higher than in Clarington.

The tax rate is calculated by taking the sum of all assessed homes and dividing it by how much it costs the Municipality to provide services. Each homeowner pays for services based on how much their house is worth. So if the overall assessed value is higher, the tax rate is lower.

Research shows that the average tax levy (the money you pay) is lower in Clarington than in most other Durham municipalities.
